HOLD THE FOAM! FREE RECYCLING EVENTS FOR STYROFOAM BLOCKS

This spring, Franklin County Solid Waste Management District is collaborating with the towns of Leverett, Montague, Northfield and Wendell to hold special recycling collections for blocky “Styrofoam™” packing material. The collections will take place each Saturday in April from 9 a.m. to noon: April 6, 13, 20 and 27, 2024. These events are only open to residents of Leverett, Montague, Northfield and Wendell.

These special recycling collections will only accept white blocky packing material and coolers made of expanded polystyrene foam (EPS or PS #6), commonly known as “Styrofoam™”. To meet these specifications, volunteers at the collection sites will review the materials that each resident brings and may reject unacceptable items. Foam items must be clean and dry. Before bringing materials to the collection, residents will need to remove any tape, labels, cardboard or wood.

These collections will not accept food-related “Styrofoam” items such as cups, plates, bowls, trays, egg cartons or take-out containers.

Other items that will not be accepted: wet/dirty materials, #4 (LDPE) foam packaging material, foam insulation board (XPS), or packing peanuts. The UPS Store in Greenfield accepts clean, dry packing peanuts for reuse. Foam materials of any type are not accepted in household recycling programs.

On Saturday mornings in April 2024 from 9 a.m. to noon, residents of Leverett, Montague, Northfield and Wendell may bring materials to their town’s transfer station. A transfer station permit is not required for these special collections. Pre-registration is not required. Space is limited and may run out; first come, first served.

The collection locations are: Leverett Transfer Station, 5 Cemetery Rd, Leverett; Montague Transfer Station, 11 Sandy Lane, Turners Falls; Northfield Transfer Station, 31 Caldwell Rd, Northfield; and Wendell Transfer Station, 341 New Salem Rd, Wendell.

The Montague collection is open to residents of Montague and its villages: Turners Falls, Lake Pleasant, Millers Falls, Montague Center and Montague City.

This effort builds on the success of the 2023 collection, where events in Montague and Northfield together diverted 90 cubic yards of foam from the landfill. Materials collected at these special collection events are recycled at Gold Circuit E-Cycling in Agawam, MA. The foam is densified and ultimately recycled into picture frames, molding, or building insulation. MI-BOX Moving & Storage supports this project with discounted rates.

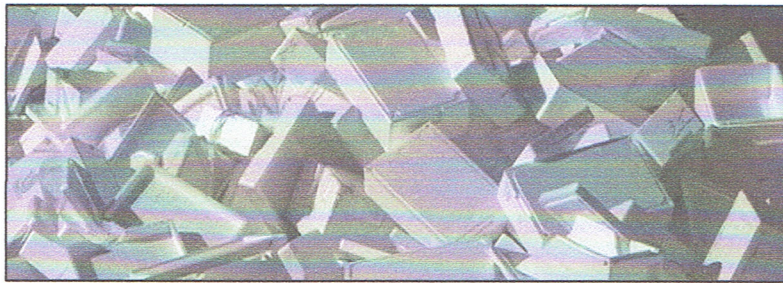

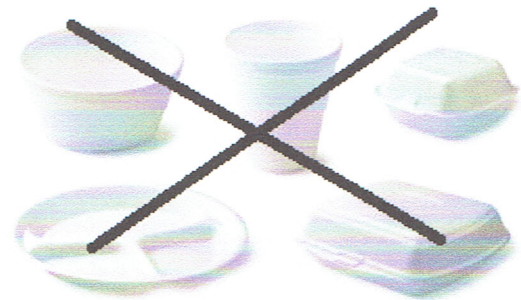

Subject: Transfer station plowing/sanding coordination

Importance: High

Hi,

As we enter the season of snow and ice I am sending my annual email about coordinating plowing and sanding with attendant's hauling requests. (I should have sent this before today!)

Every winter, attendants call in for hauls and every winter there are days when it snows as Waste Management is scheduled to make the haul. Because the transfer station is often plowed and sanded by the highway department it is usually lower on the list than keeping roads clear. That makes a lot of good sense.

The challenge becomes when the Waste Management driver leaves at 5 am to make the haul and can't get to or in the transfer station – or gets stuck.

The best solution is to have attendants communicate with the highway department when they call in a haul – and snow/ice is predicted. If the highway department is unable to clear the facility then someone in town needs to contact Chris Carabine at Waste Management so he can either delay the haul or reschedule it. With limited driver DOT hours each week it doesn't help anyone for a driver to show up and not make the haul. Chris's number is 413-348-1838.

If possible, please email Chris with a contact person and phone number that he can call (as early as 4 or 5 am) on a snowy/icy day about conditions at the transfer station. His email is ccarabin@wm.com (he is cc'd).

I'm hoping this will allow for everyone to be safe and for the drivers not to make a long trip for no service - which now costs \$200 for your town if it happens.

Just to recap: there needs to be communication between whoever calls in hauls and the highway department or whoever plows/sands. It usually takes 2 days to haul from when a call is placed. So, if a haul request is placed on Monday it will get hauled on Wednesday. If there is snow Tuesday night then it's likely a problem for the driver to show up Wednesday am.

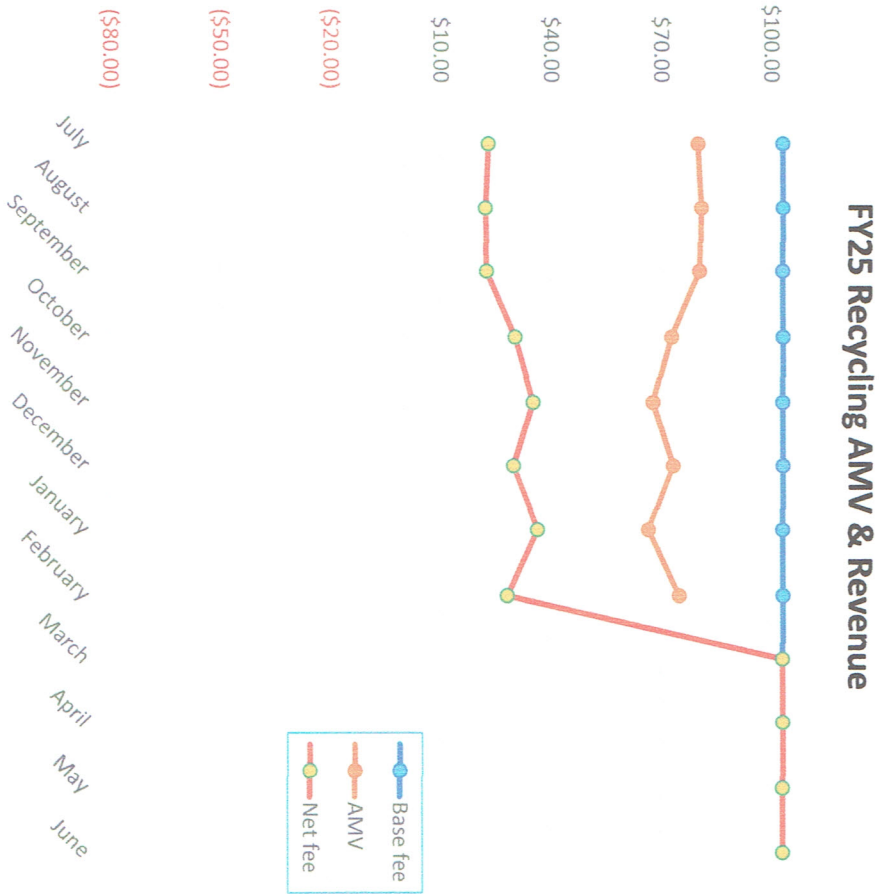

Western Massachusetts Regional Recycling Program

Program Summary

The Western Massachusetts Regional Recycling Program comprises nearly 70 contracted communities with dual stream recycling programs delivering approximately 17,000 tons per year of recyclables to the Springfield Materials Recycling Facility (Springfield MRF) for processing and marketing. The Springfield MRF is owned by the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection (MassDEP) and operated by Waste Management Recycle America (WMRA). Member communities pay a fixed cost per ton for processing. The monthly value of processed recyclables is deducted from the per ton cost. Communities interested in joining the program are encouraged to contact MassDEP (see below).

Community Contracts/Financials

Member communities enter a standard contract to deliver recyclables to the Springfield MRF for processing and marketing. The current contract terminates on June 30, 2025. A five-year renewal term has been negotiated. Communities pay a fixed processing fee per ton (see table below) for each year of the contract and receive revenue from the sale of the processed recyclables. Revenue is calculated monthly based on the current Average Market Value (AMV) per ton of the processed recyclables (see table below). When the AMV is lower than the processing fee, the community receives 100% of the AMV. When the AMV is higher than the processing fee, the community receives 100% of the AMV up to the processing fee and 70% of the AMV that exceeds the processing fee. WMRA issues monthly invoices detailing both the processing fee and revenue share credit.

Acceptable Recyclable Materials

Containers: Metal cans, foil, plastic bottles/jars/tubs/jugs, clear plastic hinged containers (clamshells), clear plastic cups, clear plastic egg cartons, gable-top and aseptic cartons, and glass bottles and jars.

Paper: Clean papers, magazines/catalogs, greeting cards, gift wrap (excluding foils or metallic gift wraps), calendars, paperbacks and phone books (including covers), corrugated cardboard, paperboard, and clean pizza boxes.

Delivery of Recyclables

Member communities are required to deliver all recyclables collected on their behalf to the Springfield MRF at 84 Birnie Avenue in Springfield. Receiving hours are weekdays 7:00 am to 4:30 pm.

Thanks Jan. Gill's Selectboard has meetings on 11/4, 11/18, 12/2, and 12/16. I won't count their meeting on 12/30; that's cutting it too close.

Within the main body of the contract, I'm ok with all the changes. The annual 2.5% increase to the Processing Fee is consistent with the first 5 years of the contract, and more reasonable than Casella's standard 5% or CPI, whichever is higher. They also snuck in an increase to the escalator for rejected loads from 2.5% to 3.5%, which is fine (knock on wood).

However... The changes to Exhibit 1 are basically a sneaky way of saying a 2.5% annual increase isn't enough! Plus, besides this new 1% Annual Processing Fee Adjustment, there is now a penalty if/when there is a reduction in the tonnage that all our towns send to the MRF. This feels like two very material changes to the financial terms of the contract, and beyond the scope of a simple 5-year renewal. I'm surprised, but I'm not, that DEP didn't decide to not renew and re-bid the contract. However, DEP has its reasons, and some of them are probably in our best interest.

So, here are my few questions:

- Realistically, are there any other options for towns besides the Springfield MRF?
- What has been the MRF tonnage for the last couple of years? How close are we to the 14,000 tons threshold that allows Waste Management to move processing to another facility?
- How many communities are currently sending their glass to other facilities to save the extra \$5? Would the weight of all that glass help meaningfully toward reliably exceeding the 14,000 tons threshold?
- Do you recommend we sign the extension?
