## Warwick Trails Group July Hike

We invite you to join us for a hike around Stevens Swamp and a visit to the "Indian Cave".

**When:** Third Sunday of the month: **July 19 at 1 p.m.**

**Where to meet:** At the intersection of Bass and Northfield Roads, proceed on Bass Road about 1.1 miles. At the tee stop, go right onto Flagg Road. In approximately 0.1 miles, bear left at the intersection. Proceed about 0.3 miles and park at the pond.

**The Hike:** Late last fall, we scheduled a similar hike but due to cold and biting winds, several folks in our large group dropped out early. Assuming no wintry weather this time, we are going to try this again!

Starting at the eastern end of the pond, we will proceed clockwise, take a short spur on the south side of the pond for a long range view, and then hike to the "Indian Cave". From there, there are two ways back; we will decide as a group on which trail to take to finish the hike. This hike is not more than 2.6 miles and has an approximate change in elevation of not more than 190 feet. Bring hiking poles if you have them, bug spray, and a water bottle. We will have maps and a trail description available.

The all volunteer Warwick Trails Group maintains some of Warwick's town owned trails, hikes and maps existing trails, plans and creates new ones, and occasionally leads hikes around Warwick.

**Spirit in Flesh - Vinyl LP:** Thanks to the generosity of a Boston-based friend of Warwick, the Library is now the proud owner of a vinyl copy of the "Spirit in Flesh" LP released in 1971 by the band of the same name, the "house band" of the Brotherhood of the Spirit community. It was the band's only release, though they had a certain degree of success as a touring act back in the day. The album's cover photo is a classic shot of the entire community (later known as the Renaissance Community) pretty much hanging off the front of their communal house in Warwick. Featuring lead vocals by the community's controversial founder, Michael Metelica.

**Local author Paul Stone - new book talk: Tuesday, July 7th @7 pm:** The Library is pleased to welcome Paul Stone of Warwick, who will read from and discuss *Convergence*, his newly published first novel. The story, set before the Civil War, concerns two characters on opposite sides of a collision between freedom and slavery.

**Non-Fiction discussion group - Thursday, July 16th @ 7 pm:** This discussion group is wide open: Could be something you're reading or listening to: science, history, memoirs, biographies; articles, books, newsletters, journals. It's all up for discussion at the new non-fiction discussion group. Come to share/discuss or just to listen and build your reading list.

**Monthly Short Story Hour - Daphne Du Maurier, July 23rd @ 7:30 pm:** We'll read selections from *After Midnight*, a collection of "thirteen tales for the dark hours," published in 2025 (with an Introduction by Stephen King). Du Maurier (1907-89), was an English writer and playwright celebrated for her "Gothic genius and stunning psychological insight." *Rebecca*, her acclaimed novel, was adapted into an iconic film by Alfred Hitchcock, who also directed an equally iconic film version of her short story "The Birds." Du Maurier spent much of her life in Cornwall, the setting for many of her books and stories. Come to read or just to listen.

**Thoughts on the April 26th Revolutionary War Interpretive Program at Warwick Library - by Ottavio Parent, 10 yrs old:** I thought Thomas Quirk's Revolutionary War presentation was really great. One reason I enjoyed it so much was because the presenter was very interactive and answered every question. He even played music on his fife, which was really cool to hear and see in person. Another thing I liked was that he let us touch and explore some of the items he brought. Usually, at school presentations, we are not allowed to handle things, so that made the experience extra special. I also thought it was really interesting that he made some of his own clothing styled after the Revolutionary War period.

## Great River Regional School District Proposal Information for Residents of Warwick—An Important Community Decision

Residents will soon be asked to vote on whether to approve the proposed **Great River Regional School District**, a new regional school district developed through the work of the Six-Town Regionalization Planning Board (STRPB).

The proposal is the result of seven years of study, public engagement, financial analysis, and planning to examine how local schools can respond to long-term enrollment and financial challenges.

### Why Is This Being Considered?

Like many communities across Massachusetts, Franklin County has experienced significant declines in student enrollment. Since peak enrollment:

- Gill-Montague enrollment has declined approximately **50%**
- Pioneer Valley enrollment has declined approximately **53%**, and Warwick was part of that decline

Among the changes that affect schools are:

- Creating challenges sustaining programs and services
- Reducing state funding tied to enrollment
- Increasing pressure on local budgets

### What Is Proposed?

The proposed Great River Regional School District would mean:

**Elementary Schools** - All current elementary schools would remain open and continue serving their communities.

**Middle School** - The Pioneer Valley building would serve as the district middle school.

**High School** - The Turners Falls building would serve as the district high school. The proposal also includes a regional governance structure, financial agreement, transportation planning, and implementation timeline.

### What Happens Next?

Each participating town will vote separately on whether to approve the proposed regional agreement. In order for the new district to be formed, all towns would have to vote to support this new six-town Great River Regional School District.

### Town Vote Information

There will be a vote in the fall at either a Special Town Meeting or a Special Election.

## About School Districts - Part I Diana Noble

Soon Warwick voters will be asked to decide whether to adopt the [Six Town Regional Planning Board's](#) (STRPB) plan to dismantle our current Warwick Community School District and join a region with five other towns.

I am writing as a resident, not as a board member, to contribute to the important conversation about this vote. Six years ago, a group of Warwick residents began working to learn about the crisis in our school district (PVRSD), and reopen our town elementary school. Our elementary students went to Northfield 2020-2023 before the current Warwick Community School and District opened.

The [Six Town Long Range Plan](#) (page 4) hints that Warwick cannot afford to operate its own small district. I disagree. The town's financial well-being was a major consideration in the decision to form our own district. We examined ways a small school can develop efficient and flexible operations to save money, and made plans to build financial reserves over time. We educated ourselves on the state Circuit Breaker program, which provides reimbursements to schools for students with extremely expensive special education needs. Specifically, this state program reimburses 75% of special education [expenses above \\$53,431 per student \(DOE\)](#).

WCS has been awarded over half a million dollars in competitive grants because of the efforts of our superintendent and leadership team, and WCS's high quality education and innovative vision. These funds are another dramatic contribution to the well-being of the town; Warwick receives an incredible value for its investment in education. Grants have allowed for more extensive counseling, individualized education, lessons connecting farm, food, and the environment, and high quality hands-on long-term projects (remember the school play?). Grants support the visiting artists program, the purchase of instruments and arts supplies, and the integration of arts and music into other academic areas; all at a time when many schools are cutting music and arts.

In most regional districts, individual schools and towns cannot raise funds or apply for grants to support just one school. Read the [proposed regional agreement](#); you will see very little that protects this kind of autonomy for Six Town elementary schools. A decision to regionalize could be unexpectedly costly.

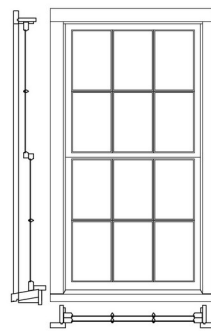
